### From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Cup family and friends,

One of the things I appreciate most about the Christian life is that we will never 'fully arrive' until we are face to face with our Savior and Redeemer, Jesus. We will not know everything here. We will not experience everything here. We will not be perfectly loving here, for we are not yet 'perfect' creations – but we are 'on the way' toward all of these things when we walk in the step with the Holy Spirit in love (1 Corinthians 13:11-13).

God is well aware that we are all works in progress, and he is able to meet each one of us at our point of need – perfectly. The band Caedmon's Call puts it this way:

You are to me
A beautiful mystery
You are to me
A servant and a king
You're a beautiful mystery

The truth is a river Where the strong can swim down deep The weak and the broken Can walk across so easily

In short, the Christian life is a life of continual growth and development. An area that God is currently at work on in me is my life of prayer. Paul Miller's *A Praying Life: Connecting with God in a Distracting World*, which we are using in our adult Sunday morning group, has been a gold mine of practical tips on coming to the Lord with the things on my heart and mind. I particularly appreciate the diagrams he uses to demonstrate the praying experience, and some of the temptations and difficulties we can fall prey to. Last week's lesson focused on unanswered prayer, and the difficulty that happens when our hopes in God remain frustrated by a reality feels very different from what we want. Miller calls this dichotomy 'the desert.'

Miller describes it this way:

The hardest part of being in the desert is that there is no way out. You don't know when it will end. There is no relief in sight.

A desert can be almost anything. It can be a child who has gone astray, a difficult boss, or even your own sin or foolishness. Maybe you married your desert. . . God takes everyone he loves through a desert. It is his cure for our wandering hearts, restlessly searching for a new Eden. . . . After a while you notice your real thirsts. (Psalm 63:1)

The desert becomes a window to the heart of God. He finally gets your attention because he's the only game in town. (pgs. 184-185)

I have been intentional about talking with God through prayer for at least 35 years, but I still have a great deal to learn. I especially have a great deal to change in my *practical doing* of prayer, and I suspect that is true for many of us. I'm thrilled to recognize myself in some of the problems Miller describes, but I'm even more excited when I fill out a prayer card and see God answer something, or I regain a desire to pray for someone, because I've been reminded that the Lord is actually at work when I pray, not just on someone or something else, but on my *own* heart.

Take a few minutes and ask yourself the following questions. What is something God has shown me about Himself in the past month? In the past 6 months? What is something I have learned about myself that God is changing to be more like him in that period of time? What is a Bible chapter or verse that has affected by decision making in the past week? Is there someone I've reached out to in the past month that is in need?

These questions, and others like them, give us a chance to evaluate where we are with God, and, perhaps, where we stand with others. (I have been asking us to reflect on these relationships as we prepare for communion in worship.) Friends, let's spur each other on to grow in our relationship with the living God: There's so much to be discovered!


