From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Cup family and friends,

'If it were a crime to be a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict you?' This is a classic question, and has typically been a theoretical one for us in the United States. Yet in many other parts of the world, including West Africa, this is a query with very real consequences.

Sierra Leone is a nation that is officially 80% Muslim and 20% Christian. Almost all of the Christians, however, are found in the urban centers of the country. In the villages, Islam and secret societies are all most people know. As Christianity has been introduced in the northern village of Fintonia, close to 200 men, women, and children have come to professing faith in Jesus, many of them from the Susu tribe, a group that has never before put their trust in Christ. As the church has begun to grow, however, some forms of persecution or opposition have arisen.

This opposition has never taken a form that has been threatening to me personally or to any of the other Anglo missionaries involved in the EPC work in Sierra Leone. Rather, it appears through some (not all) Muslim Imams scolding the adults in their mosques for allowing their children to come to church. There has also been some accounts of Muslims withholding food from Christians during their fasting in their holy month of Ramadan, although I'm not aware of any children's health getting compromised when this has happened. The Koran teaches that the lowest section of hell is reserved for those who grow up Muslim, but covert to another faith (i.e. Christianity). It has been scare tactics like this that have caused problems for the young church, not only in Fintonia, but in some of the other villages we serve.

On our latest visit, Pastor and new Edunations president Samuel Sesay addressed this topic head on at the community meeting that was jammed with hundreds of people in the village open-air pavilion, including the region's paramount chief and all of the other important local politicians. The crowded conditions only added to the stifling 100+ degree heat. Samuel opened with the appropriate niceties, but then turned his talk to what Christians had done since coming to the village a few years before. They had fixed existing schools and built new ones. They had repaired the local ambulance. They had provided working wells for fresh water. They had given life-saving surgery to a young boy who was near death. At the end of each statement, Samuel said, 'I leave it to you to decide – what kind of people are these Christians? If you meet them, should you smile at them, or slap them?' The response was electric – in a good way. He had simply described what Jesus had said: 'By their fruits, you shall know them.' (Matt. 7:15-20)

What about us? If people are suspicious or even hostile to what we believe, what practical acts of kindness and service can we provide to demonstrate our desire to 'bless and not curse'? (Romans 12:14) Before our neighbors, co-workers or family members will have an interest in finding a merciful God, they will want to know where they can find a merciful neighbor. May they find such a neighbor in you and me!


