From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Cup Church family and friends,

What's the best news you've ever heard?

For me, it was hearing a 'yes!' to the breathless question, 'Will you marry me?' There are other items of news about my family that would also be considered great news –

'Mother and baby are doing fine!' 'Nothing broken – only stitches!' and so on. For me, like many of us, news tied to people I love and care about is especially important.

Here at Cup we're offering to share the best news ever heard through a Sunday evening growth group opportunity called 'Christianity Explored'. Some of you may remember that we offered this two years ago, and the feedback was so positive that we've decided to offer it again. We'll gather for a simple dinner together at 6:30 in fellowship hall, start up the video in the Bartholomew Room (upstairs in the education wing) around 7:15, and will wrap things up by 8:30. The course will run 8 weeks. Christianity Explored is an attractive, understandable walk through the first written and shortest of the accounts on Jesus' life – the Gospel of Mark. Mark has been used for centuries as the gateway for those interested in learning more about Jesus and Christianity. The plot moves quickly, the action is compelling, and the opening and closing of the book are unforgettable.

In fact, Mark begins his whole account this way: 'The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.' 'Gospel' literally means 'good news,' news along the lines of 'war is over!' or 'you've won the lottery!' As the account unfolds, however, it's difficult to see how Jesus is going to effectively communicate this great message. His power is evident, but it is often met with misunderstanding and even fear. Jesus also tells many people after a spectacular encounter with him to not tell anyone what has happened! While many people over the years have read Mark's gospel on their own and come to trust in Jesus as their Lord and Savior, many others have found that it's helpful to read the account with others, particularly those who have studied it for a number of years.

Christianity Explored uses 12-15 minute videos with a British host named Rico Tice to set the stage of what's happening in the text in an understandable and relevant way, but once that is done, we're provided the opportunity to ask our own questions and come to our own conclusions about what Mark says about this Jesus. I believe this 8 week course is one of the best ways yet developed to help our friends and family members who are not yet followers of Jesus to consider his claims and what it means for them. The combination of food, fellowship, presentation, and of course the good news of the message itself is irresistible for many. If you have never tried a growth group, or if you have a friend or family member who you've been praying for, or if you just want to check Jesus out for yourself, I encourage you to come along! Our organizational gathering is *Sunday, October 1*, but people can join up easily through the first couple of weeks. Hope to see you there!

LIBRARY NEWS

Star Struck by Dr. David Bradstreet and Steve Rabey is a new book that will be on our shelves soon. As it's subtitle, "Seeing the creator in the wonders of our cosmos" suggests, this book can enable us to join other Christians in exploring God's handiwork. We live in a time of exciting astronomical discovery and exploration. With this book the authors take us on a journey to explore the stars, asteroids, galaxies, nebula, black holes and other cosmic displays that have been discovered. "Star Struck" is the story of people seeking to better understand the Creator's character by studying his two sources of communication to us—scripture and nature. Bradstreet introduces us to other men and women of faith who study newborn stars, search for earthlike planets, and who experience the wonder and awe of exploring our elegant cosmos. The book can help readers better understand new developments and better appreciate the majesty and mystery of the God who created and still sustains us, and the cosmos as a whole.

David Bradstreet is an award winning professor, author, and astronomer who has been teaching students at Eastern University since 1976. At Eastern he serves as professor and chair of the Astronomy and Physics Department and as director of the Bradstreet Observatory and Fowler Planetarium. He earned his PhD in astronomy and astrophysics from the University of Pennsylvania and has worked with NASA, and the National Science Foundation. Steve Rabey is the award winning author of more than 40 books. He has an MA in church history at Denver Seminary and has taught at Denver and Fuller seminaries as well as the US Air Force Academy.
