From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Cup family and friends,

When the apostle Paul was on trial, on more than one occasion he would simply appeal to the historical reality of Jesus' resurrection. He says at one point, "What I am saying is true and reasonable. The king is familiar with these things, and I can speak freely to him. I am convinced that none of this has escaped his notice, because it was not done in a corner." (Acts 26:26) The events of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection were historical: they happened in particular locations, with eyewitnesses to record the events. As John puts it: That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched – this we proclaim concerning the Word of life. The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us. . . we write this to you to make our joy complete. (1 John 1:1-2, 4)

From April 3-13, four of us from Cup church – Jud Herter, Beth Hesselson, Paula Keefer and myself will be taking a tour of many locations in Israel, as part of a group from the Presbytery. We will be travelling in the towns through Galilee, look on Bethlehem, and spend several days in and around Jerusalem. We will return just before Palm Sunday. As one of the pastors on the trip, I'll be offering some brief teaching and devotions when we are at Capernaum and Mt. Carmel.

I've been told by other teachers and pastors who have been to Israel that the experience transforms their teaching. We'll see! Geography certainly plays an important part in both the Old and New Testaments. For example, when Jesus feeds the five thousand in the gospel of Mark, it is in a primarily Jewish location (Mark 6:30-44). Yet after Jesus and disciples cross the sea of Galilee, they are in a primarily Gentile location when he feeds the four thousand (Mark 8:1-13). It's another way of demonstrating that Jesus' mission wasn't to just one group of people – it was to the wider world. Mark's original audience would have picked up on this, but our distance in both time and geography can cause us to miss it. I can tell you I was deeply moved when I had the opportunity to stand on Mars hill in Athens, and see for myself the challenge Paul faced in explaining the gospel to the Greeks (Acts 17). Nevertheless, I was also blessed to know that God has been faithful in allowing each generation since that time to hear and receive the good news of great joy about Jesus.

We don't need to cross a stormy lake to share the gospel with someone who may not really know it – most of us have an opportunity to do this right on our own streets!

My hope and prayer is that you and I will grow in our hope, trust, and motivation to get to know our neighbors in a more meaningful way this Spring, and invite them to share in the joy of the Easter message with us. Jesus came to earth to open the lifegate for us, and the Holy Spirit is here now to help and encourage us in our mission. So whether we are in Jerusalem or New Galilee, let's make our OWN joy complete by sharing what God has done!



There are two excellent new movies put out on DVD by the Affirm Films subsidiary of Sony in our church library video section. The first is "Risen" starring Joseph Fiennes as a powerful Roman military tribune who is given the task of solving the mystery of what happened to Jesus. He is given orders by Pontius Pilate following the crucifixion in order to disprove the rumors circulating through Jerusalem that Christ has risen. The Roman leaders are fearful of an uprising in Jerusalem if the populace begins to believe that Jesus is the Messiah. The Biblical story told through the eyes of a non-believer can give new insight to the events that changed the course of human history over two thousand years ago.

The second new movie on our shelves is "Paul, Apostle of Christ". Shakespearean actor James Faulkner stars as the apostle Paul and Jim Caviezel stars as his friend Luke. Paul, near the end of his ministry is spending his last days in a Roman prison cell awaiting execution by Emperor Nero. Luke, risking his life to be near and support his friend, begins work writing the book of Acts in order to document the beginning of the Christian Church.

Both movies are rated PG-13 and can be checked out anytime you are at the church library. Just sign the card in the pocket on the back of the case and leave in the basket on the table against the side wall.

We also have three new "I Can Read" books for young readers in our children's section; "Baby Moses and the Princess", "Do Not Fear, God is Near" and "God Made the Colors". Come check us out!
