Dear Cup family and friends,

Today I came across this: 'So far, 2020 is like looking both ways before crossing the street and getting hit by an airplane.' I don't think I'd necessarily disagree! Just when we think our daily lives can't get any more challenging, another one comes along. Pandemic, racial and police tension followed with urban violence and looting for weeks on end, the worst start to the hurricane season in the US on record, wrangling over the best way to provide education to our children at every age level. . . I'd ask 'what could possibly be next?' but I know we have a presidential election coming up!

When we are faced with challenges that leave us feeling emotionally spent, we have a couple of choices: we can either give into the fear or anger that has brought us to this point, or we can lean into the 'fear' of the One who has inexhaustible resources. What do I mean?

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

Proverbs 1:7

The book of Proverbs is far more than snippets of good advice along the lines of Ben Franklin's almanac, although it certainly contains that. 
The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life, turning a person from the snares of death.

## **CUP LIBRARY NEWS**

Rachel Scott was an average teenager growing up in the Denver Colorado area in the 1990s. She was a young Christian believer who although she was sometimes ridiculed by fellow students, and struggled with the kind of issues any teen faces including doubts about her faith she stayed true to God. Then on April 20, 1999 she was killed at Columbine High School while continuing to affirm her faith to fellow students.

The book "Rachel's Tears" was written by her parents Beth Nimmo and Darrell Scott along with Steve Rabey and will soon be on our shelves in the Cup Church library in the youth section. It is hard to believe that this tragedy occurred more than twenty years ago but Rachel's story still has an impact today. The book contains first person narratives, journal entries, drawings from Rachel's diary and alternating viewpoints from both of her parents. Her parents want the world to hear her story and challenge the readers to create a revolution of compassion that can make a real difference in our troubled world.
