From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Cup family and friends,

I've used this greeting in my newsletter pretty much in my entire tenure here at Cup church, but what does it actually mean? Some of you have likely seen the recent Gallup poll that shows for the first time in American polling history, less than 50 percent of Americans say they belong to a church, a synagogue, or a mosque. In 1999, the figure was 70 percent. What's going on?

For some, the ideas of individualism have increasingly crowded out any belief in truth or validity beyond one's own personal beliefs. Robert Bellah coined this new religion 'Sheliaism' in his 1985 sociology classic on America, Habits of the Heart. Such a person draws on a smattering of widely scattered ideas to create 'my own little voice.' In our current age of hand-held devices offering us everything from our favorite version of the news to our favorite version of ourselves, this certainly seems to be the favorite religion of the present, if not the future.

For others, following Jesus Christ is not the issue. Jesus is seen as the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, and they trust him as such. The issue for them is more: What is the church? Scripture leads us to the comparison with family (1 Timothy 5:1, 1 John 2:12-14), a household (Galatians 6:10), and a temple of living stones (Ephesians 2:19-22). Joe Carter, in a helpful web article for the Gospel Coalition, points out that also an embassy (see 2 Cor. 5:14-21).

Carter writes, 'A church is not the kingdom, for the kingdom of God is not of this world (John 18:36). Rather, the church is an outpost of the kingdom, or what we could call an embassy. An embassy is an institution that represents one nation in another nation. . . It declares its home nation's interests, and it protects the citizens of the home nation living in the host nation. A church is a real-life embassy, set in the present, that represents Christ's future kingdom and his coming universal church.'

Our surrounding culture's views of people, the world, our identity, and our purpose in life are increasingly at odds with what we find in the Bible. Even the way we face THIS is different than how the world tells us to act toward those who differ from us.

With eyes wide open to the mercies of God, I beg you, my brothers (and sisters), as an act of intelligent worship, to give him your bodies, as a living sacrifice, consecrated to him and acceptable by him. Don't let the world around you squeeze you into its own mold, but let God re-mold your minds from within, so that you may prove in practice that the plan of God for you is good, meets all his demands and moves towards the goal of true maturity. (Romans 12:1-2, Phillips)

Our Sunday School classes will be resuming on April 11 at 9:15, and our topic will be Reading the Signs of the Times: Loving and Following Jesus while understanding our Neighbors. Without understanding the ideas of the world around us, we'll be incomprehensible to those who aren't Christ-followers around us. And without developing a shared love and appreciation for the Triune God, we won't have anything worth sharing with those who aren't Christ-followers around us. Both of these goals take the shared community and love that the church family provides. Let's recommit to the family of faith as we have opportunity to come together again for worship and fellowship in Christ!

The book is called "The Case for Easter" and the author is Lee Strobel. What you may not have realized is that we have a series of books in our library that are written by the same author. Strobel, who has a journalism degree from the University of Missouri and a Master of Studies in Law degree from Yale Law School, was the legal editor of the Chicago Tribune and considered himself an atheist until 1981.

In 1979 his wife surprised him by becoming a Christian and in the years to follow challenged him to put his journalistic talents to work investigating Christianity and then "follow the evidence". The result was a series of books like the three that are now part of our library, "The Case for Christ", "The Case for a Creator", and "The Case for the Real Jesus". His books are dramatic and are no-holds barred quests for the truth.
