Dear Cup family and friends,

Once upon a time, there was no 'Middle School' in the journey through public education. 'Junior High' started in seventh grade and went through ninth grade in the district I was a part of. I loved my time in elementary school. In sixth grade, I was a part of the 'in crowd,' as far as I knew, because I received good grades, spoke politely to my teachers and classmates (most of the time), and volunteered to help with extra jobs around the classroom as needed. To be picked for a role such as cleaning blackboard erasers (remember those?) was seen as a sign of respect. To be a 'teacher's pet' was not exactly desired, but it wasn't necessarily scorned. Singing Barry Manilow in the school talent show brought cheers.

Junior High involved a changed unwritten student handbook. After a couple of weeks, I realized raising my hand to offer an answer in class was taking me down, not up, the social ladder. My initiation into moving from class to class occasionally involved talking to friends headed the same direction, but it often involved dodging hallways or bathrooms where unaware seventh graders were tripped up, or hit with a falling shelf of books from someone who had 'stacked' your locker. Riding the bus to school, also a new experience, was a social nightmare. Singing Barry Manilow in the school talent show brought jeers (truly). It seemed everything I had learned about social interaction was wrong, at least when it came to the kids who were my own age. I didn't know where I fit into a world that appeared to have changed overnight.

Followers of Jesus Christ in America in 2021 may be wondering the same thing. Christian faith and church attendance is dropping dramatically among younger people, and it's increasingly common to hear the view that Christianity isn't simply something to be ignored, it's to be opposed.

The apostle Peter wouldn't be surprised. Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something stranger were happening to you. . . if you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. (1 Pet. 4:12, 14) Peter knew, and experienced firsthand, the cultural misunderstandings and rejections that the early church received from the hands of the Greeks, Jews, and Romans around them. Some persecution came out of fear, some out of hatred, some from misunderstanding. Yet Peter is confident that the Lord will protect and nuture the scattered little flock of the church: The God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. (5:10)

In a culture where the rules seem to be changing, it's important to take time to allow our minds and hearts to be shaped by God's word, worship, prayer, and developing deep, supportive relationships with other Christians. Many of the ideas our secular neighbors embrace are rooted in the Bible, but they have become distorted to the point of harming people instead of helping them. As we come out of this pandemic season, we're finding more friends, family members, co-workers and neighbors looking for hope, help, and a home. Life has become confusing for many! Yet the new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus is still true today (1:3). May we receive it for ourselves – and share it with someone else today!






<u>BLACKHAWK HIGH SCHOOL</u>

<u>Caleb Haas</u> – graduated with highest honors. He will be attending GROVE CITY COLLEGE in the fall majoring in English with a minor in Music.


