## From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Cup family and friends,

Elton Trueblood, a wise Quaker Christian who served as chaplain at both Harvard and Stanford (in a much earlier time) wrote: 'Faith is not belief without proof, but trust without reservation.'

Kristina and I are having the opportunity to put Dr. Trueblood's definition of faith to the test.

In early June, I received an email from a respected pastor, saying he had received my name from a mutual friend, believing I would be a good fit for an Associate Pastor position with their congregation. I appreciated the thought, but was skeptical. The church is in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, of all places! I shared my doubts, but asked for the position description to take a look at it.

What I read put my heart in my throat a couple of times. I responded by saying, 'I've never considered serving a church south of the Mason-Dixon line, but it feels like I could have written this myself! You have my attention.'

From that initial exchange, we have come to have faith that God is calling me to serve at First Presbyterian Church as the Associate Pastor of Pastoral Care, Prayer and Spiritual Formation. My doctoral program and thesis is concentrated on precisely these areas, and the enthusiasm of the committee about my interests and gifting led us to believe a new adventure of faith is in store.

It has been a joy and a privilege to serve as your pastor for the past 18(!) years. The Lord has led us through a number of exhilarating peaks and treacherous valleys together. Over the next several weeks we anticipate many conversations filled with memories, some tears, but also laughter and gratitude. I am confident that God has a tremendous pastor who will partner with you for the ministry to come in Chippewa, Beaver County, and the ends of the earth. My final Sunday in the pulpit will be October 2, but our friendship, love, and prayers will continue long after that. While we look forward to making many new friends in Baton Rouge, our door will be open to any and all of you to come visit us in Louisiana. As soon as we have an address, we'll share it with you! Session will be working with members of our Presbytery to bring the right pastor to lead the transition. I can tell you that one of the greatest gifts of moving into the Evangelical Presbyterian Church is the candidate pool that you will be able to draw from as you pray and look for the next installed pastor of this wonderful congregation.

My closing sermon series will be on some of the apostle Paul's prayers. These are verses we can lift up for each other, and 'being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.' (Phil. 1:6)

We will miss you, Cup family. But in Christ, we know we will always meet again!

The book is titled, "The Miracle of the Kurds" and is written by Stephen Mansfield. Mansfield is a New York Times best-selling author and has written many other books. He first began to travel among the Kurds in the early 1990's as part of an international relief team and he describes how the Kurdish people have enriched his life. The stories presented in this book are true although the author has changed names to protect the security of those involved and shortened or combined stories for the sake of clarity.

Another new book recently added to our shelves is "Let the Journey Begin" by Max Lucado. In his book Lucado offers guidance, words of wisdom and support from the scriptures. He shares true stories and advice for the reader who faces the unknown and lets us know that God is with us every step of the way! This book has been donated to our library by a member of our church in honor of her granddaughter's graduation.


